Dear Parents, Whanau and Caregivers,

The Board will have ample time to develop a process to select and appoint a new Principal to start in Term 2, 2019.

Safety Around School

With a lot of wet dark weather it is important that all drivers take extra care around school. Often hats and coats block children's vision and they don't see cars quickly. Please drive slowly. Other points to consider are:

- Only let children in or out of the car on the left-hand side of the road so they step onto the footpath.
- Please make sure that children are buckled in.
- Drive 40 Km/hr or less around school
- Watch for children if you are driving or backing out of driveways

Other safety tips:

- DO NOT park across driveways as this creates issues with our neighbors
- DO NOT park on yellow lines or on the grass outside houses
- If your child is biking or scootering to school please make sure that they have the skills to do so safely

SCHOOL WILL BE CLOSED

The Teachers Union, the NZEI has confirmed that there will be a full day strike on Wednesday 15 August. This is in an effort to negotiate salaries that will attract people to the profession. Every week at Rototuna Primary we struggle to find relievers and teachers preparation time has to be postponed. There has been a 40% fall in the numbers of teachers entering the profession and 20% of the teachers are 60 years old or over.

Unfortunately, we do not have the staff available to open the school on Wednesday 15 August.

I do understand the inconvenience and hassles this will cause for families and students. This Friday 3 August between 8.30-8.45 and 3.15-3.30pm our NZEI staff rep, Karen Blunden will be available at the front of the library to chat with any families and explain the reasoning behind the strike action and answer any questions you may have.

Resignation

It is with regret that the Board received and accepted the resignation of John Luxton from the Board. John has been on the Board for 2 years with 18 months as a Chairman. He brought a great many skills to the role. As he works out of Hamilton he was finding it very tiring and demanding to get to meetings. I appreciated his efforts, thank him for his work and wish him well.

The Board has decided to fill this casual vacancy by appointing a replacement until the Board elections in May 2019.

If 10% or more eligible voters on the school roll ask the board, within 28 days of this notice being published, to hold a by-election to fill the vacancy, then a by-election will be held.
