

Of course it is ANZAC Day tomorrow. It has been lovely to see many families place a poppy or two on their windows to acknowledge this. Some may be standing at their gates at 6.00am tomorrow morning. That will be a lovely way to acknowledge this significant date.

As a lot of planning has been required to organise bubbles of 10 students or less, as well as designing procedures and systems to manage student and staff's needs and safety, students who have not been registered as returning to school during Alert Level 3, cannot attend school during this time.

For those students who have been registered as needing to attend school during Alert level 3, learning will look different - they will continue with their online learning, similar to those who have learners at home. They may also engage with the Learning TV channel at school.

Whānau who have registered their child to attend school during Alert Level 3 will receive an email on Tuesday 28 April, with important information and Health and Safety guidelines for them to follow. Failure to comply with strict health and safety requirements may result in a child being asked to stay at home, or a child being sent home.

A reminder, that teachers will be offline on Tuesday 27 April, as the Government has made this a teacher only day, so we can do last minute preparations for school life in Alert Level 3.

As we head to a long weekend still in Level 4 lockdown, time to close the devices and hopefully enjoy some lovely weather. We wish you and your family all the best for a happy and safe move to level 3 next week. Take care in your bubbles.
